- 6. Painting low voc
- 7. Lease Smoke Free
- 8. CFLs
- 9. Appliances Energy Star
- 10. Green Cleaning Greenseal, Ecologo or Dfe certified
- 11. Flooring: smooth and cleanable
- 12. Flooring: Green Criteria FloorScore, and Green Label Plus carpet
