New resources, such as:

- Unlocking the Power of Home-Based Asthma Services: Model Health Benefit Packages, a tool for managed care plans and allies describing the scope, staffing, and services associated with home-based asthma services that identify and address environmental asthma triggers in the home environment. The tool includes tiers of services to provide a range of options for payers at different levels of readiness and includes recommendations to support action from critical stakeholders.
- *Roadmap to Sustainable Asthma Home Visiting*, an interactive tool to support action to provide in-home asthma services. Nine rearrangeable, primary waypoints are provided along with one possible route as an example for those who want a premade path.

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
