The environments where we live, learn, work, and play have a profound impact on our health. This paid summer fellowship program will give two candidates with an interest in environmental health an opportunity to intern with the <u>National Center for Healthy Housing</u> and the <u>Children's Environmental Health Network</u>, two national organizations leading the fight for healthier environments. This opportunity is reserved for people of color, or those who identify as such.

The persons selected as this year's fellows will be invited to choose from a range of projects and/or submit their own ideas for projects related to a broad array of children's environmental health and healthy housing topics and may take a variety of different approaches to addressing public health challenges (e.g., research, policy, training, awareness building, communications, capacity-building).

Fellows are asked to commit to 320 hours of work (spread over 8-15 weeks) and will be compensated \$7,500 (\$15 per hour plus a \$2,700 fellowship stipend to be paid in two installments of \$1,350).
