Dear Chair Cassidy and Ranking Member Sanders,

We write to you in response to the news that tens of thousands of federal employees of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) were laid off on April 1, 2025. We appreciate your inviting Secretary Kennedy to participate in a hearing on these drastic actions and the proposed reorganization of HHS. We are also looking forward to the opportunity for the committee to hear from Secretary Kennedy about the HHS FY26 budget on May 14. We are writing to urge you and your committee members to include questions about the impacts of the layoffs on environmental health programs at CDC in this hearing.

As reported by multiple news sources, staff were laid off across the Division of Environmental Health Science and Practice within the National Center for Environmental Health. Specific programs that are now without staff supporting them include the Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program, the National Asthma Control Program, the Environmental Public Health Tracking Network, and other key programs that protect public and environmental health. Subsequently, news reports of statements by Secretary Kennedy indicated that some programs may be reinstated, including the Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program; however, HHS has also stated that the personnel are *not* being reinstated. We need clear answers on the status and future of these essential programs and the services they provide to the American people.

Every year in the U.S., tens of thousands of people die from preventable environmental hazards like radon and carbon monoxide, hundreds of thousands of children are exposed to lead, and millions of people have asthma. Every state in the country, as well as DC, Puerto Rico, Guam, and several localities, receives funding from at least one of the programs within NCEH. For example:



- Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program: 48 states, DC, and Puerto Rico currently receive grants from this program to identify and provide support services to children who have elevated blood lead levels.
- Environmental Public Health Tracking Network: 32 states and one county currently receive grants from this program to build, operate, and maintain tracking programs and data portals and networks for environmental health.
- National Asthma Control Program: 27 states, DC, and Puerto Rico currently receive grants from this program to conduct and analyze asthma data and address indoor and outdoor asthma triggers.

These programs help our communities keep our air, water, food, homes, schools, and environments clean, prevent our children from being poisoned, provide valuable public health data, and respond to extreme weather and natural disasters. These programs are cost-effective, returning benefits to society worth many times what we spend on them, and they are vital to keeping us all safe in our homes and communities. And the CDC staff who support these programs provide valuable technical assistance, support, and guidance to the states and localities that rely on this funding to protect the health of their residents.

At the hearing, we request that you direct questions to Secretary Kennedy that will provide more information about the future of these programs, such as:

- On April 3, you stated that the Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program will be reinstated. Subsequently, your department said the personnel for the program are not being reinstated. Can you clarify the discrepancy between these comments and confirm whether (and if so, how) the program will be reinstated and whether CDC will be able to continue to perform its essential functions, including surveillance of blood lead levels, management of grants, support for state and local programs, and guidance for clinical assessment and management of lead poisoning?
- Please clarify the status of the other programs under the National Center for Environmental Health, including the National Asthma Control Program and the Environmental Public Health Tracking Network. If these programs are not reinstated, who will be responsible for conducting the important data surveillance and tracking functions of these programs? Can you confirm that existing grants to states and localities under these programs will not be impacted?
- CDC's environmental health programs provide vital public health infrastructure, and cutting them threatens to undermine every other agency and state and local



government trying to address issues like lead and asthma and protect their residents. Cutting these programs also jeopardizes CDC's ability to conduct surveillance on important environmental health issues and means that the federal government will be flying blind going into the next environmental health crisis. Is the National Center for Environmental Health and the programs operating under it proposed to be moved to a new agency under your proposed HHS restructuring, and if so, what are you doing to ensure a smooth transition of services?

- How does eliminating the National Asthma Control Program and other services provided by CDC's environmental health teams fit with your stated goals to "Make America Healthy Again" by addressing chronic diseases, including childhood asthma?
